The Misterton Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group welcomes your comments on the Draft Neighbourhood Plan.

The Steering Group has done its best to balance the needs and aspirations of residents with the need for more housing.

Now the Steering Group wants your views!

On Saturday 21 April, the draft Neighbourhood Plan (and its supporting documents) will be in the Library for residents to see and comment on. Members of the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group will also be available to answer questions.

This session runs from 10.00am to 3.00pm.

It begins a 7-week consultation period (until Friday 8 June).

Saturday 9.30am – 12.30pm

There is a response form on these websites, and there are copies in The Misterton Centre & Library.

The comments made in this, the third round of consultation, will also be recorded. The Draft Neighbourhood Plan will be amended, then it goes to Bassetlaw District Council to pass on to an independent examiner. There will be further consultation and a referendum.

Hopefully, all this will happen this year.

If approved by the community, the Neighbourhood Plan must be taken into account by the planning authority, Bassetlaw District Council, in determining planning applications.

The Draft Neighbourhood Plan is based on residents' views. First, from the questionnaires that went to all houses (and as many businesses as the Steering Group could identify) in 2016. There were also open events in the Red Hart and the former Dovecote Café.

Second, from the site allocation exercise (leaflets to all houses, some house-to-house visits, and an open event in the Methodist Hall) in 2017.

Consultation has also involved sessions with pupils at Misterton's school and at other local schools and colleges. All the consultation events and activities are summarised towards the end of the Draft Neighbourhood Plan.
